#### From the Desk of Deacon Matt

This Monday commemorates the day when the Auschwitz concentration camp was liberated by the Soviet army in 1945, 80 years ago. The day remembers the killing of six million Jews, two-thirds of Europe's Jewish population, and millions of others by the Nazi regime and its collaborators. The Holocaust was the result of step-by-step decisions by individuals that led to the largest genocide in the history of mankind in a wave of antisemitism, intolerance, and hatred. The holocaust was real, it happened. I know, because half of my family were lost. The Holocaust matters to us because it is one of the most, if not the most, extensively documented instance of atrocity, hatred, dehumanization, and apathy in world history. The Holocaust also matters because as it was happening, the world stood by and watched—not just Germans, not just Europeans the world. Sadly, it seems like the world forgets it's past. I think it's time for us, as a world, to do a reset. Our value of human life and dignity appears to be taking the same path it did in the early 1940's. We need hope for a better future. This year the Catholic Church welcomes and embraces the Jubilee Year of Hope for just that reason. The concept of a jubilee year had its origin in the ancient Near East whereby every fifty years debts would be forgiven, servants would be released, property would be restored to its original owner, and fields would lie fallow. According to Leviticus, the "Jubilee" was a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home. Pope Francis has designated the 2025 Holy Year as a time to renew ourselves as "Pilgrims of Hope". I was once taught that hope means confident expectation. We are a people who confidently expect the peace that comes from our Risen Lord, our Messiah, the one who saves. Our Gospel today shares with us when Jesus is invited to read in his hometown's synagogue, in the little town of Nazareth, he finds the passage in Isaiah that speaks of the jubilee year, then announces that this passage is fulfilled then and there in him. Since Jesus is with us when we gather in his name, here in the little town of Blue Grass, it is fulfilled here and now as well. As we are now celebrating the Jubilee Year of Hope, may we find in Jesus the hope, that confident expectation, that this jubilee year may be fulfilled in our hearing. Shalom Shalom

- Marriage contact at least 7 months prior to the proposed event.
- **Anointing** Anyone having surgery or experiencing illness may ask for the Rite of Anointing of the Sick. Father Bud will anoint immediately after Mass. Contact Deacon Matt.
- **Funeral Preparation** if you would like help in preparing the Mass and Worship service for you or a loved one's funeral, please contact Deacon Matt. A great booklet is available to help.
- ❖ Helping those Becoming Catholic or Joining the Catholic Church. Now is the time to ask those who regularly visit us, or anyone interested in learning more about our faith, to join our OCIA process. OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults.
