


CEW - Christian Experience Weekend

From the Desk of Deacon Matt

When making our many pilgrimages to the Holy Land, one of the must-see places is the Wedding Church at Cana, where today's Gospel account is from. The most common occurrence at this site is.... the renewing of wedding vows. One year while Lisa and I were leading a pilgrimage we had amongst our group several people who were not married. And my heart felt so torn, do we JUST celebrate the occasion of those who are JUST married, or do we open our hearts and our compassion for those of us that have indeed their own vocation hood...perhaps the single life, the Consecrated life or even the Priesthood. From that time on when I have had the honor to perform such a service, I have included everyone, in their own vocation, so all of us can enjoy this sacred location. It's hard to imagine anyone who visits Cana to not feel, much less see, the first sign, or miracle of Jesus. It is here at Cana that Jesus reveals his glory and a way for those who observe them to receive the gift of faith. But transforming water into wine was much more than a way to ensure that the wine would not run out at this couple's wedding banquet. It foreshadows one of his final signs, which he performs at the Last Supper when he transforms bread into his Body and wine into his Blood. By commanding the disciples to continue to do this in his memory, he ensures that it is his Blood that we receive at the Eucharistic banquet each time the Eucharist is celebrated. So, there is great meaning to celebrating Mass here in the Church of Cana if you can do so. True story: One year when our joy of celebrating the renewal of our "vocation" vows went a tad bit long, we started Mass behind schedule, and half way through Mass this tiny Filipino nun comes out and shuts the Mass down. That had never happened to us, but the nuns were on very tight schedules and had to leave the Church for the evening. Well, we HAD to finish Mass. So, we went back to the Hotel and celebrated Mass on the edge of the Sea of Galilee. Nothing was going to take the joy of our encounter with Jesus away. Just as the joy of the guests at the wedding banquet in Cana was not allowed to run out, the joy we share in the Eucharistic banquet will also last forever.

- Marriage contact at least 7 months prior to the proposed event.
- **Anointing** Anyone having surgery or experiencing illness may ask for the Rite of Anointing of the Sick. Father Bud will anoint immediately after Mass. Contact Deacon Matt.
- **Funeral Preparation** if you would like help in preparing the Mass and Worship service for you or a loved one's funeral, please contact Deacon Matt. A great booklet is available to help.
- ❖ Helping those Becoming Catholic or Joining the Catholic Church. Now is the time to ask those who regularly visit us, or anyone interested in learning more about our faith, to join our OCIA process. OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It's a process through which non baptized or baptized non-Catholic men and women enter the Catholic Church. It includes several stages marked by Study, Prayer, and Rites at Mass.
